## The Heart of the Matter

In March, Arizona Greyhound Rescue (AGR) received a grant from Charter Funding that partially covers a pilot heartworm-testing program. As Doc Holliday has shown us, this was a good move. In the past, heartworm disease was almost exclusively in the hot, humid parts of the country like the Southeast and Texas. With increased humidity and mosquito populations, it is now in every state, including Arizona, where several hundred cases are diagnosed every year. Dogs are susceptible here, but we also acquire retired racing greyhounds that have traveled from track to track from all parts of the country.



Heartworms are several inches long and come from bites of infected mosquitoes that infest the heart and lungs of a dog. Without treatment, dogs die from this disease. Treatment involves two separate arsenic-based injections into the back muscles of an infected dog. Doc is recovering from his painful first treatment and awaits his second dose. The total cost is \$2,000.

It is far better and cheaper to get your dogs tested for heartworm (about \$35-\$40 at your veterinarian) and then put them on preventative like Heartgard Plus (about \$45 for a 6-month supply) than to go through treatment. Your dog must have a negative test before preventative treatment can be started. We recommend year round preventative for your dogs so they always have protection.

Your cat is susceptible to heartworm disease as well. Unfortunately, there is not good testing or treatment for cats at this point.

AGR hopes to get the rest of this valuable testing program funded. Doc Holliday asks you to get your dogs tested and on heartworm preventative. And while you are at it, consider tick and flea treatment, especially for the warm months. There are several nasty tick-related diseases your dog can get too. ## **Adoption Scoop**

AGR now has a great team of adoption coordinators working together from Santa Cruz County to South Maricopa County and everywhere in between. Since January 2006: intakes-38, carryover from 2005-12, adoptions-34, rebounds-3. Please check out our available dogs online:<<http://azgreyhoundrescue.org/hounds.htm>>; we have a constant supply; here are a few: Arnold and Wynonna are doing well in their respective foster homes. Six-year-old Arnold is a great big lover boy returned to AGR when his owner died. Found wandering in Oracle, Wynonna is a greyhound mix with excellent house manners. Both will be perfect companions but are not cat or small dog tolerant. Energetic Bill needs an experienced and savvy adopter. After Doc Holliday's heartworm treatment, he'll be ready to find his way into your heart. Blanche, 7, a former brood mama, loves stuffed toys and gets along well with other dogs.

## Grant Writing

In March 2006, AGR established a grants committee to seek much needed funding. Chaired by Glenda Taylor, additional active members include Jerry Tucker, Scott Marchand, and Valerie Pullara. During monthly meetings and subsequent emails, the committee has recently completed and submitted an application to PETCO for Valley Fever testing for all greyhounds prior to adoption. Valley Fever is a growing problem in Arizona.

The committee's goal during 2006 is to develop a solid foundation by creating templates of information that are regularly required by potential foundations and funding organizations. These include progressive annual charts reflecting the number of hounds rescued, fostered, and adopted; income generating events, volunteer activities, board biographies, and financial statements. As we move forward this year, we will also continue applying for appropriate grants. In May, the committee welcomed new member, Valerie Pullara, who has significant experience in writing grants. With Valerie's expertise and guidance, the committee is confident of meeting its goals. ## Who Let the Dog Out?

Recently, we have had several lost and found calls. The good news is all hounds and humans were reunited. The bad news is in at least four instances, the dogs were without collars and/or current tags. Without this information, it's difficult and tedious to accomplish a quick reunion which causes much anguish for all concerned. Dogs were from AGR and Greyhound Adoption League; we work jointly for lost and found calls.

A dog's collar and tags should be worn at all times except during a bath. Your dog should be wearing an AGR tag, a tag with your current phone number, and a current county license. (Pima Animal Care Center can be a great ally when trying to reunite adopter and dog.) Contact us if you need a new AGR tag and for only \$2, your hound will have extra insurance.

Escapes were through unlocked gates, unlocked front doors, and one from an adopter who has always let her dog run from the car to the door unleashed. The dog had never run away until this one time. Good luck calling your hound back when they go on auto-pilot. These dogs were all lucky as most were near heavy traffic areas. The alternative is escaping into the washes and desert.

Remember to:

Wear collars and tags always

Lock gates and doors

Ditch retractable leashes

Keep your hound leashed unless in a confined area

Buy a squawker and keep it by your door

And if your hound should escape, call AGR right away (886-7411) so we can get the word out

## Wanted: Foster Homes

There are so many crucial things that every rescue group needs and for Arizona Greyhound Rescue, foster homes is one of them. Since racing greyhounds spend their lives in crates and have never walked on tile or watched television, fostering a hound is a great way to socialize a dog and get him house savvy before going to his forever home.

Fostering is a great opportunity for people who already have hounds and for people who don't or can't for some reason but especially for retired folks, students, or military personnel.

Your responsibility includes feeding, housing, socializing, and teaching positive home behaviors to your foster dog. We also ask that you take the dog to meet-and-greet events where they get exposure from potentially interested parties and show her to prospective adopters who may come to your home. We handle medical needs that may arise.

Yes, it is often hard to give up your first foster, but you do so knowing she is ready for her new forever home and that you played a vital part in that process. And then you gladly foster another...

## On the Run

In March, Arizona Greyhound Rescue, Greyhound Adoption League, Greyhounds-2-Go, Arizona Greyhounds Inc., and *Greyhound Network News* met with Tucson Greyhound Park representatives and state racing stewards to open dialogue and create a greater sense of cooperation among all.

We learned there are 10 kennels at TGP with approximately 70 dogs each. A couple of kennels closed and left dogs which TGP cared for and eventually hauled to out of state adoption programs. Every year 600 dogs retire from TGP and the four local adoption groups cannot absorb this many dogs which means adoption groups in states where greyhound racing is not legal will have to be advised of the problem and be part of the solution.

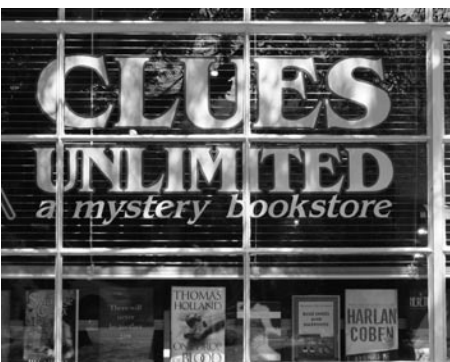
